The day started with three birdie chances on the first and yours truly battling for a solid par, in what was a sign of things to come, with **Daly** opening with an easy birdie to claim an early lead. **M Walsh** started with 5 straight solid pars to stay level with **Daly** through what was a quality played front nine.

With 17 points on the front 9 you would think I would be in contention but **Walsh** and **Daly** turned in 21 showing their best golf when it mattered most. And spare a thought for our 4th member **Chalky White**, who played an excellent front nine in 20 points which on a different day would have had him leading, but not to be with **Walsh** and **Daly** in such good form.

After an inconsistent start to back 9, I turned into an enthralled spectator in this ding dong back 9 battle between the two gladiators which truly went down to the very final putt. **Walsh** raced into a two shot lead playing some fine stuff midway through the back 9 and the Kerry-man looked a beaten man, the memory of 82 coming back to haunt again. In dire situations like these, I decided it would be an appropriate time to bring out the carefully packed lunch I had so diligently made for everyone that morning - **Chalky** jumped at the opportunity to satisfy his hunger but the two gladiators were too focused to eat, their minds solely at the task in hand. **Daly** was focused on mounting a comeback and with three to play they were dead even lining up the spectacular finish.

Having just smashed a iron to 15 feet to secure some consolidation with a closest to the pin prize (or so I thought), I watched in awe as **Daly** struck a beautiful fade with his 5 wood inside me to 12 feet and converted the birdie 2 on the 197 yard uphill tester. It was here he turned a 1 shot deficit into a 2 shot lead – surely the Green Jacket was his?!?!

However, Offaly men are made of stern stuff and **Walsh** made a solid par on 18 for 3 points meaning **Daly** had to score a point to tie and secure the coveted gold. **Daly** played safe laying up in two and myself and **Chalky** then increased the pressure on his next shot by both shanking our approaches into the water, and a clearly put off **Daly** left his 4th shot short, & then sailed his 5th through the green. With a 30 feet downhill putt off the green, needing a 2 putt to win and a crowd on interested onlookers watching, **Daly** glided a beautiful putt to win inches of the hole to secure the coveted point and the glory of the 2015 green jacket.

It was an absolute pleasure to be part of the final group and watch the great golf played under the finest sportsmanship, with all the glory on the line. Well done to **Tom Daly** on his fine victory, to **Michael Walsh** for his part in an incredible battle and with a points total that surely would have won in other years, and to **Chalky** for his great golf and for being the only man to enjoy my carefully prepared sandwich! Match Play Recap of 2015



With Sam Maguire already in the bag by September, the Dubs were guaranteed victory in the second Green Tour competition of 2015, the Match Play, given that two Dubs had made their way to the final. The Match Play report from July indicated that the smart money should on a **Jim O'Sullivan / Brian Boland** pairing in the final match, with Boland winning to cart off his first Green Tour major. It goes to show that the smart money is not so smart after all...

Previous winner Martin McDonnell demonstrated his undoubted pedigree by being the first to reach this year's final. After good wins over recent Major winners Don O'Reilly and Kieran McGill, McDonnell went through Boland for a shortcut with a hard-to-believe final margin of 6&5. Boland had lived up to his favorites tag until he faced McDonnell, comfortably accounting for Brian Mahony and Tom Daly in a serene procession to the bracket final. Daly had high hopes after accounting for his nemesis Michael McBrearity in the first round; in hindsight, exiting the Match Play competition might be the best thing to have happened to Daly, giving him time to focus all of his attention on the race for the Green Jacket.

McDonnell was followed into the final by fellow Dub **Colm Reilly**. Reilly was no slouch in the early rounds, beating out Norn Iron's best in **Peter Casey** and **Ian Murdock** before swatting aside pre-tournament favorite **Jim O'Sullivan**. With no holes-in one in 2015, this has been a pretty barren year on the golf front for O'Sullivan, but all due credit to him for getting all his weddings out of the way in 2015 so that he can return his focus to golf in 2016. Reilly faced **Irial Finan** in the semi-finals, with Finan himself demonstrating remarkable form. Finan's generous winning margins over **Brendan McGuinness** and **Ciaran Morris** hinted at his competition making smart career moves, but his beating of **Paul Valentine** in the first round suggested that Finan was a serious contender this year. However, Colm Reilly shredded Finan in the semi-finals on a scoreline of 5&4, showing that he meant business.

A Dub v Dub final didn't have quite the glamour of 2014's final match where the pride of Galway played against one of Dublin's finest, raising memories of the 1983 Gaelic Football Final (remember Ciaran Duff?). However, the nature of the competition in the final was of the highest quality, with the match hanging in the balance until near the end. McDonnell went into 2-hole lead after just two holes, but Reilly fought back to level things up after four holes. The lead changed hands in a see-saw affair until the 16th hole, where with a touch of class and no

little skill, Reilly holed a 40-foot birdie putt to take a 1-up lead. Reilly held his nerve to par the 17th, and that was enough to take the title on a score of 2&1.




