A review of the 2020 Season of the Green tour:



In another nail-biting finish to the Green Tour, the winner of the coveted Green Jacket for 2020 was ultimately decided with the final putt on the final green of the final round at the everpristine Creekside course at Golf Club of Georgia.

After a 13-year hiatus, the man from Cork (*Northside*), and former two-handed single-digit golfer entered the rarefied air as a <u>four-time winner</u> of Atlanta's foremost and prestigious Green Tour event. Match Play Event: Brian Mahony

With that in mind, this year's winner is all the more remarkable not just for rising to the top as the Match Play Major Champion of 2020; Mike Adams has the distinct honor of winning the Major for two years in a row. Let that sink in for a moment... a pandemic was far from our minds the last time Adams lost a match. Over the last couple of years, Adams has beaten Major winners Ciaran Morris, Eoin Lehane, Fergal Kearns (twice), and Chalky White amongst others.

Morris had done well in getting to the final; victory over Noel Goggin by 2&1 in his first match showed that he's made of stern stuff. Then, he beat Kieran McGill by the finest of margins before dispatching 2019 Green Jacket Winner, Jimmy The Grip.

Other notable performances in the competition include Paul Valentine's thrashing of Brian Mahony by 5&4; Valentine looked to be cruising against Tom Daly in his next match, but Daly justified his reputation as a man who likes to come from behind, winning a remarkable match on the last. Tremendous Canty won a high-quality match against Chairman Michael Walsh in the first round. The Grip looked unbeatable in early rounds, with margins of 6&5 and 4&3 but lost out to Morris in the semi-finals.

Looking to 2021, who wants to be drawn against Michael Adams? It's a double-edged sword – on the one hand, glory awaits the David who can defeat this golfing Goliath, but on the other hand, he has the look of a man who can't be beaten. We'll know soon enough – bring on the fun of the 2021 Matchplay season!
